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| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Additional teacher in Year 6, to provide targeted teaching and learning to focus pupils, as a result of data analysis. • Learning Mentor and Intervention Projects Leader, to provide intervention support to targeted pupils, to remove barriers to learning. • Attendance/Family Liaison Officer, Parent Support Advisor and Parental Engagement Strategic Lead, in order to improve overall levels of attendance, reduce the % of persistent absentees and lateness, further develop parental engagement across school. • Family Learning opportunities developed and facilitated by the Parent Prefects and the Parent Support Advisor, in line with the Curriculum. • Funding for Breakfast Club Cook, Walking Bus Staff, to support issues with attendance, welfare etc, targeted pupils. • Enhance teaching and learning within the Curriculum, through subsidising trips and visits, |

linked to the Whitgreave Curriculum.

- Enhance attendance levels, through the development of individual and group rewards for good levels of attendance across school.
- Additional After-School Club provision, to support healthy lifestyles and the wider curriculum.
- Develop opportunities to embed the School Curriculum, via the Whitgreave Wheels.
